<u>Oral hygiene</u> is the repetition of keeping one's mouth fresh and free of disease and other problems (e.g. bad breath) by frequent brushing and cleaning of the teeth. It is primarily that oral cleansing must be done on a daily basis to allow avoidance of dental disease and bad smell. The utmost mutual categories of <u>dental illness</u> are <u>tooth decay</u> (cavities, dental caries) and gum diseases, containing gingivitis, and periodontitis.

Dental assistant help make dental treatment more efficient by assisting the dental care provider. They hold and pass instruments, <u>retract tissues</u> and apply suction to assist better vision of the operating field. They also mix materials, help maintain dental records, and sterilize instruments and equipment. Some also engage in professional teeth whitening procedures, particularly in The Republic of Ireland where laser teeth's whitening is classified as a cosmetic procedure and not dental treatment. This practice usually occurs in clinics solely devoted to laser teeth whitening and not routine dental treatment.

<u>Dental therapists</u> are licensed dental auxiliaries in some countries. They specialized in caring for children's teeth and oral hygiene. Local dental regulations determine the duties therapists are allowed to perform. Typically, therapists under the prescription of a dentist are licensed to examine children's teeth, administer some forms of local anesthesia, take radiographs, and provide sealants, scaling, and cleaning for children. They also may work in restoring primary teeth and administer vital pulp treatments such as <u>pulpotomies</u>.

Dental technologists are dental professionals who fabricate dental appliances: removable protheses including dentures and orthodontic retainers, and fixed restorative work such as crown and bridges for the dental operator to insert. <u>Denturists</u> or clinical dental technicians are dental technicians with postgraduate training who see patients to fabric and fit dentures

Common rules recommend <u>brushing</u> two times a day: after breakfast and before going to bed, then in an ideal world the mouth would be cleaned after every meal. Cleaning between the teeth is known as interdental cleaning and is essential as tooth brushing. This is for the reason that a toothbrush cannot reach in the middle of the teeth and as a result only removes about 50% of plaque from the exterior of the teeth. There are several tools to clean between the teeth, containing floss and <u>interdental brushes</u>; it is up to respectively single to choose which tool they prefer to use.

On occasion white or straight teeth are connected with oral hygiene. On the other hand, a hygienic mouth can have stained teeth or crooked teeth. To advance the appearance of their teeth, people may use tooth whitening treatments and orthodontics.
